If you deem the risks associated with your planned activity to be 'trivial' there is no need to formally risk assess - you must still complete this form but tick in the Trivial Risk box when you reach Step 6

EQUIPMENT AND THE BEACH:

Equipment from the Kit Room must NOT be used on or near the beach as small particles of sand and sea spray can cause significant damage. If this occurs you will receive a penalty fee.

There is equipment listed on SISO specifically for beach use - please make sure you book this equipment if filming is unavoidable.

If you have any queries regarding the suitability of equipment in certain locations please consult with the Technical Support team (WG10) who will be happy to advise.

USING ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT OUTSIDE:

We DO NOT recommend using any mains powered electrical items outside. However, when electrical equipment is being operated outside using power from the mains supply you must adhere to HSE Code of Practice BS7909-2011 which covers using temporary electrical systems for entertainment and related purposes (this includes using lighting systems, location lighting and television equipment). All electrical equipment used in this way MUST be installed by a fully qualified electrician (evidence required).
